Can I use a voltage converter in Switzerland?

It can be extremely dangerous to use an electrical appliance that is rated at a voltage different from the supply. As voltage can differ from country to country, you may need to use a voltage converter or transformer whilst in Switzerland. If the frequency is different, the normal operation of an electrical appliance may also be affected.

What type of electrical outlet does Switzerland use?

What voltage does Switzerland use?
